This one-day course will be an introduction to the sport/science of cave exploration. Participants will meet at the Altamont Stewart's at noon SHARP. From there we will caravan to Schoharie Cavern, Gallupville, NY (approximately 30 minutes) There will be an approximately 90-minute tour of the cave featuring abundant formations as well as shallow rapids and pools. The cave is a stream passage with air and water at around 46 degrees so participants should be dressed warmly and expect to get fairly wet from walking in the stream and drippage from the cave ceiling. There will be no crawling involved, but participants should wear work gloves and sturdy workboots or walking shoes. A COMPLETE CHANGE OF CLOTHES IS HIGHLY RECOMMENDED. There is a 2-level cabin available for privacy on site.

Heldeberg Workshop will provide helmets but participants must be equipped with THREE DIFFERENT LIGHT SOURCES--NO EXCEPTIONS; preferably one should be a headlamp to keep hands free. A change of shoes and a plastic bag for dirty clothes are also recommended.
